Complicated watches with automatic-winding mechanical movements need a lot of care and attention — and this is exactly what they get from a Scatola del Tempo container. These mechanical “rotor” cases are specially designed to keep your watch wound for you while you're not wearing it.

In fact, it can take care of your entire collection — by means of a rotating mechanism that duplicates the natural movements of a person's wrist while they're awake. These remarkable Scatola del Tempo boxes offer up to 10 different re-winding programmes, calculated to coincide with the wearer's normal daily activity schedule, and there is also an indicator that shows the state of the batteries (which generally last for up to a year).

The 1RT Pendulette, for example, features an electronic system enabling it to rotate for exactly 1,300 revolutions per day after being
